



# Kids-for-Cash Scandal

## Overview

The Kids-for-Cash scandal exposed judges who accepted millions in kickbacks from private juvenile detention facilities in exchange for sentencing children to incarceration — often for minor or questionable offenses. This corruption destroyed countless young lives and revealed deep flaws in juvenile justice oversight.

## The Problem

# Veteran Suicide Crisis

## Overview

## The Problem

## The Problem

- The U.S. has over 2 million incarcerated individuals — the highest in the world.

- **Independent Oversight:** Civilian boards to investigate abuse claims.
- **Compassionate Release:** Expand parole for elderly and infirm prisoners.
